

## **ONLY ONE REMAINS!**

Of the seven school buildings in Noblesville in 1967, only North Elementary remains in service. The other six have been demolished, sold or repurposed.

In 1966, North Elementary replaced First Ward School (1888-1966). In 1967, Second Ward School was the oldest. It was built in 1873 as a high school (first NHS) and in 1900 it became primarily an elementary school. It housed students until 1968 when Stony Creek Elementary opened on the south side. Stony Creek also absorbed Third Ward School students. Third Ward was built in 1892 and after 76 years of student wear-n-tear, it also closed in 1968.

The large school building on Conner Street was initially the new High School (second NHS). The academic wing toward the west opened in 1900 and the gymnasium building to the east in 1923. It became the Junior High building in 1955 when the new High School opened on Harrison Street (third NHS). It ceased being used for a school in 1968 when the new Junior High opened on Field Drive. The Harrison Street NHS building was sold to Ivy Tech Community College which opened the campus in 2014.

Conner Elementary School was the first school built in Noblesville for 60 years when it opened in 1951. It was the first elementary with a gym and cafeteria. It closed in 1989 when Hazel Dell Elementary opened. Forest Hill Elementary School was added in 1961. It replaced Federal Hill School (which became the Opportunity School) and Wheeler School which were for township residents. Forest Hill closed in 2011 and it was sold to the City of Noblesville which resold it to Legacy Christian School.

from upperclassmen. We forgot our locker combinations, got lost and felt overwhelmed by all the new faces. We soon found our way into our studies, activities and sports. We were impacted that year by the Halloween Coliseum explosion and the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

With one year under our belts, we eagerly began our sophomore year. The year was highlighted by ordering class rings, getting our driver's licenses, dating, serving at prom and no longer sitting in the top rows of convocations and cheer block! Our Homecoming float, "Weave A Win, Sew It Seams", took 2nd place honors. The independence we achieved with our driver's licenses let us drive the famous three- mile strip between Jim Dandy and Ramsey's Drive-In!

Our junior year finally brought us upperclassman status. A lot of us were working and saving for college. Our Homecoming float was "Genuine Lebanon Tiger-Guaranteed to Bleed". (We won!) Our social lives revolved around school activities. We ran the Junior Booth. We participated in Thespians, band, choir, Canteen Board, FHA, N-Club, Shadow and Millstream staffs, Sunshine Society, cheer block and sports. We enjoyed after-game dances and Wednesday night canteen. We worked hard and presented "Rhapsody in Blue" for the senior class prom.

The years had flown by and suddenly we were seniors! King of the Hill, head honchos... time to strut our stuff! Wear our senior cords! Time to face Mr. Dellinger, our class sponsor, and Government and Economics. We started the year with a 22nd place finish on Band Day at the State Fair with Denny Howard, our drum major. With chicken wire and crepe paper, we con-



structed our third Homecoming float at Fahrenkamps', "Winnie says Pooh on the Hornets". (We didn't win but should have!) Activities besides float building

included a bonfire, parade, football game (we lost), and an after-game dance where the girls wore mum corsages. Who can forget the sound of the football team's cleats as they walked down Harrison Street to the football field? Our festivities included the crowning of Marilyn Stone as Homecoming Queen. The Fall Wind-Up crowned Phil Stevens as Mr. Football. Thespian Troupe 24 presented "Our Town." "Toyland" was the theme of the Christmas dance. The Canteen Board sponsored the Wednesday night canteens. The money made funded the

Christmas and Homecoming dances. Any athlete who earned a major letter award in any sport was eligible for membership in N-Club. Organized cheer block was a source of pride for NHS. Spirit soared as 500 members, boys and girls, traveled to Carmel to watch opening play of the basketball sectional. Marching in, singing and clapping to "We are the Millers" was a sight to behold. Too bad we lost, but we remember our entrance!

Spring brought golf, baseball, track, prom, senior banquet and graduation. Our senior prom was Royale Romantique, a picturesque garden with a brick-walled pond surrounded by flowers. It looked like an ancient medieval castle. Our Prom Queen was Julie Huber. After Glenn Duncan's commencement speech and our graduation, we scattered in the wind, but everywhere we go, people want to know, who we are, so we tell them, WE ARE THE MILLERS!
