





# Levinson High School in Noblesville?

From 1918-20, Noblesville High School was sometimes referred to as "Levinson High School". The person the school was honoring was native son, Salmon O. Levinson. He was a successful Chicago attorney, philanthropist, and international statesman. His parents had migrated from Prussia to Noblesville in 1857 where they raised 5 children and established a clothing store on the South side of the Square. Salmon was the eldest son, born on 12/29/1865. He graduated from Noblesville High School in 1882, undergraduate at University of Chicago and Yale University in 1888. He earned his law degree from Lake Forest College. He acquired a national reputation in corporate law. He became involved in national and international politics following WWI. He was instrumental in the attempts to have all nations sign a treaty outlawing war. He consulted with presidents, senators and ambassadors. He authored most of the Pact of Paris which was the treaty for all countries to renunciate war. 62 nations signed the treaty and Salmon was nominated for a Noble Peace Prize in 1930 for his efforts.

Salmon never forgot his hometown, frequently returning and maintaining regular contact with its affairs. In 1906,

he started an award for the highest academic male and female at NHS and NJHS. The Levinson Award was \$50 in gold. It is still awarded today (not in gold). In 1915, he and his brother donated funds to construct the Noblesville Masonic Lodge. In 1917, he donated \$10,000 (in todays dollars \$221,529) to help with the construction of the new gymnasium building for the high school on Conner Street. He also donated \$1,000 in 1927 for the construction of Forest Park Golf Course. In 1938, he donated his family's homestead on South 8th Street to the City and it was used for two different City Halls. It is part of the site of the new huge apartment complex, The Levinson. He stayed in touch with the NHS Alumni Association and was the principal speaker at the annual banquets in 1916 and 1925.

The Noblesville community wanted to recognize Salmon for his generosity. So in 1918-20, the name, "Levinson High School" started being used in many school documents including the Commencement and school programs. The official name remained "Noblesville High School" and reference to Levinson started to wane in 1923. Salmon Levinson passed on 2/2/1941.


We were blessed to be able to perform with musical talent – instrumentally with the Pep Band, Stage Band, Concert Band, Symphony Band, and the Marching Millers! Complementing the Marching Millers were our lovely Majorettes and Twirlers. Vocally talented with our choirs – the Melodiers and the A Capella choir along with the Crescendos all led by Jane McFarland (who unbelievably in 2019 at the tender age of 96 was still teaching in Waco TX)

Fond HS memories seem to always bring sports to mind! The Millers were multi-talented – Track and Cross Country, Tennis, Swimming, Golf, Wrestling, Baseball, Basketball and Football. Games won and lost – conference play and sectionals – letters earned and sewn onto jackets. Sporting events cheered on by pep rallies and booster clubs with Miller spirit encouraged by our Cheerleading squads. We had added opportunities to be athletic with GAA and Intramurals.

While each sport generated enthusiasm and Miller Spirit – Football held a special spot for many of us -it was a tradition of celebration with Homecoming – building the floats, pep rallies, the parade, the game, the Homecoming Queen, the dance. As Freshmen we didn't have beginners' luck, our float didn't win and sadly carried over to the game against Elwood (we lost!) As Sophomores we came in second with "Fry em in Greece" a nod to the Crawfordsville Athenians but did not take home a game victory. Our Junior year we played the Sheridan Blackhawks, won the game, but lost the float competition. At long last our Senior year we once again played

Crawfordsville – won the game and won 1st place for our egg laying duck who proclaimed "Quack Quawfordsville" In the words of class sponsor, Mr. Dellinger "He who quacks last, quacks best" (it's OK to groan here!!)

As Seniors our Mighty Miller Football team ended the season 7-3 and one game seems to particularly stand out – it was against our nemesis, Carmel, we're behind and there's 1:40 left in the game – Butch Reel kicks a field goal, and the Millers win 19-18. Sweet! To top off this winning season, Butch along with Scott Jaimet, Rick Byram and Tom Knotts were all named as honorable mention on the All-State 1st team!! Miller Pride!!

Our 15-member volunteer board works hard each year to host a fun filled banquet for all of you to be able to attend and reminisce with your NHS classmates. We honor our 50-year class and with your generosity, we raise money for scholarships for many of our deserving graduating seniors. We have 5 members with over 20 years of experience on the board and we are fortunate to have several new members that bring with them new ideas for us all to consider.
